Task Force Mission

- To define and standardize terminology for electromechanical, forced, and sub/super-synchronous oscillations
 - Enhance and Update the WECC Oscillation Analysis Working Group (OAWG) Document, "Bulk Power System Oscillation Terms"
 - Develop a detailed white paper that outlines definitions, classifications and real-world examples for analyzing and mitigating power system oscillations.
- Support effective communication and consistent analytical practices for oscillation monitoring, detection, classification, and mitigation
 - Contribute to evolving standards and best practices that guide real-time monitoring, modeling, and mitigation of power system oscillations.
- Integrate insights from related task forces









Updates – Kickoff Meeting

- Held the task force kickoff meeting on July 10, 2025, to discuss objectives, scope, and timelines for developing a comprehensive white paper on power system oscillations
- Engaged representatives from academia, industry experts, and utilities
- Prioritized revising the OAWG document to incorporate sub/supersynchronous oscillations and include new case studies, such as those involving large-scale data center loads
- Action items assigned to some task force members
- Set a preliminary schedule for document updates (05/2026) and white paper draft completion (07/2026)
- Scheduled monthly follow-up meetings to review progress
